Fingernails must be no longer than the tip of the finger and must be clean with no signs of dirt/soil. Nail polish can be worn but must be freshly manicured, free of chips. Artificial or gel nails may not be worn. Research has shown that chipped polis, artificial or gel nails retain bacteria.

Volunteers must not carry their cell phone (personal or work) during their volunteer shift. Please leave them in your car or locked up in the Volunteer Services office. Cell phones can interfere with medical equipment and patient care.




Cell Phones
