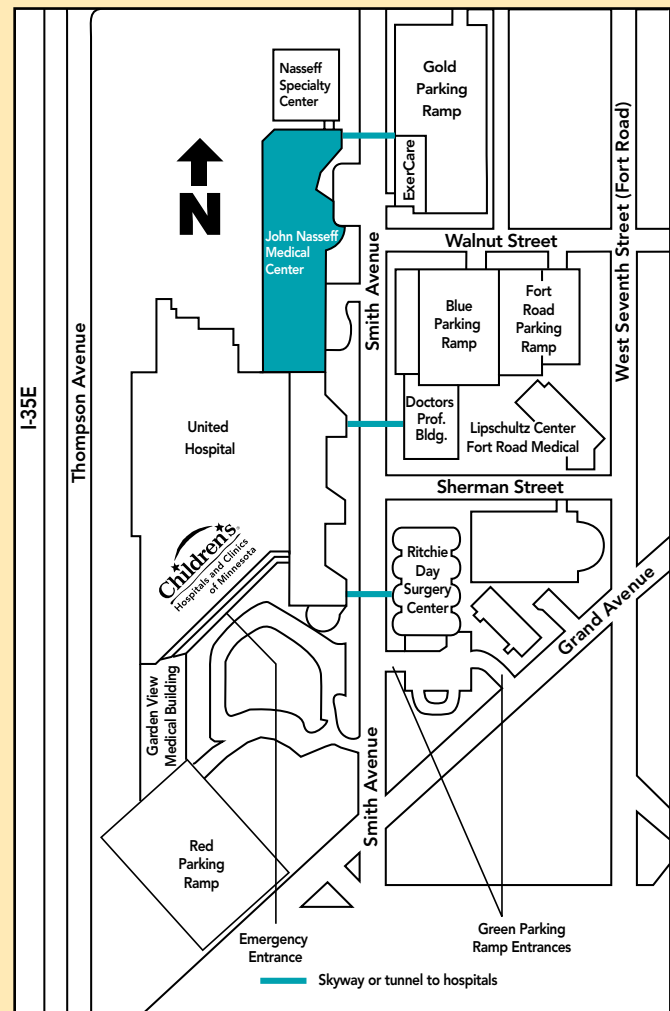

PROGRAM OVERVIEW
