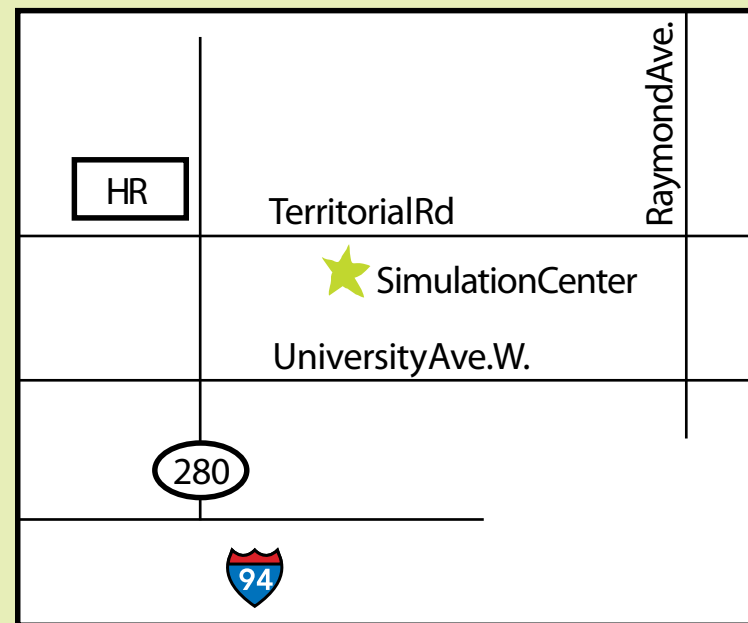

About PALS

The Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) Provider course prepares participants to identify and treat cardiopulmonary arrest and common conditions that may lead to cardiopulmonary arrest in infants and children.

Program Objectives

Participants should be able to demonstrate the following knowledge objectives and psychomotor skills at the end of the course:

- Review pediatric Basic Life Support (BLS).
- Recognize impending respiratory failure and shock.
- Initiate treatment based on the patient's physiologic status as identified by rapid cardiopulmonary assessment:
 - Provide basic and advanced airway management skills.
 - Obtain vascular access.
 - Initiate appropriate fluid and pharmacologic therapy.
 - Stabilize and evaluate the trauma victim.
 - Initiate the first 10 minutes of pediatric resuscitation.
 - Triage the patient to definitive care.
 - Participate in simulation training, using patient simulators.
 - Provide support for patients, families, and fellow providers in coping with a child's critical illness, injury and potential death.

Intended Audience

This course is designed for pediatricians, emergency physicians, family physicians, nurses, paramedics, respiratory therapists, and other advanced life support providers who are responsible for the well-being of infants and children.

Pre-Course Requirements

Participants should receive a provider manual approximately one month prior to the class. If you do not receive your book, please contact the PALS office. BLS is recommended for this PALS course. It is not required for participation. However, participants need to demonstrate BLS proficiency in class.

* For renewal students, we ask that your PALS be current or recently expired in the last three months.

Successful Completion

Each participant will receive an American Heart Association PALS card based on successful completion of the course and its components. Successful completion does not guarantee or predict a successful level of future CPR and advanced life support performance.

BLS Health Care Provider Renewal

At Children's we understand that it can be difficult to schedule time to renew all of your various certificates. At the PALS class you will turn in the online certificate and complete the four skills assessments (1-2 Infant CPR, child and adult, and competency with an AED) during the PALS course.

After registering for the add-on BLS renewal, the PALS coordinator will contact you with your pass code for completing the online component. When finished with the online course, you will be instructed to print a certificate of completion to bring with to the ALS class. At the PALS class, you can turn in your certificate and complete the skills portion of BLS that is not covered during PALS.

Details

All classes are taught at the Children's Simulation Center near 280 and University Avenue. Class days begin at 8 a.m. and typically conclude by 4:30 p.m. *Denotes night class which begins at 3 p.m. and ends at 11 p.m.

The PALS Training Center reserves the right to cancel courses due to low numbers of registrants. Notification of cancellations will occur within two weeks of the class.



Fees are due with registration. Personal checks or money orders should be made payable to: Children's Hospitals and Clinics of Minnesota.

A PALS manual will be mailed prior to the class. Children's reserves the right to cancel and reschedule classes due to a low number of registrants.

All cancellations received two weeks prior to the first day of class are subject to a \$25 administration fee.

Cancellations received one week prior to the class are subject to a \$50 administration fee. Students who are canceling must return their manuals in unopened and reusable condition or an additional \$40 fee will be charged.

No shows will be charged \$100 to re-schedule and must re-schedule their course date within one month or forfeit their tuition. If an entire course is cancelled, registrants will be notified at least two weeks prior to the date of class and will be allowed to re-schedule or receive a refund. Walk-ins are not accepted.
