The PALS initial provider and refresher classes will be completed through the on-line AHA PALS HeartCode. PALS HeartCode will be appear in your self-service 24hrs after registering for the class. The online PALS HeartCode content needs to be completed prior to attending your skills session. **Print and bring your AHA on-line PALS HeartCode part 1 completion certificate to your skills session.** 

BLS Heart Code will continue to be automatically assigned to you when you register for your PALS certification and will appear in your Self Service. The BLS skills check can be completed on campus utilizing the Voice Activated Mannequins (VAM) prior to class or at the SIM center after the PALS skills check session has finished. Print and bring your AHA on-line BLS HeartCode part 1 completion certificate to your skills session.

## To receive your PALS and BLS certifications

- Complete the AHA on-line PALS and BLS Heart Code and submit the certificates at the beginning of the skills check
- Successfully complete a Respiratory or Shock scenario and one Cardiac scenario.
- Achieve CPR competency on the Adult and Infant Voice Activated Mannequins (VAM)
- Sign in and attend the entire skills session
- Complete and submit the evaluation form at the end of class.
