*Pre-kindergarten immunizations may be completed between ages 4-6.

**Tdap: Children ages 7-10 years who were not fully immunized with DTaP should receive a single dose of Tdap vaccine to catch-up to the schedule. This child should then receive a Td dose every 10 years and does not need a Tdap at their 11-12 year clinic visit. This vaccine is usually given at age 11-12 years but may be given early.

†Influenza: Once a year during flu season.

‡HPV: This vaccine requires 3 doses. The second dose should be given at least 2 months after the first dose. The third dose should be given at least 6 months after the first dose. The first dose may be given at 9 year checkup or later.
